

## ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

(General Laws, Chapter 180)

#### ARTICLE I

The exact name of the corporation is:

International Association for Biological and Medical Research (IABMR) INC.

#### ARTICLE II

The purpose of the corporation is to engage in the following activities:

- (1) Providing a platform for professional interactions and collaboration among scientists across all disciplines of biological, pharmaceutical and medical research.
- (2) Providing consultation, education and assistance to the global biomedical research communities.

#### ARTICLE III

A corporation may have one or more classes of members. If it does, the designation of such classes, the manner of election or appointments, the duration of membership and the qualification and rights, including voting rights, of the members of each class, may be set forth in the by-laws of the corporation or may be set forth below:

## ARTICLE IV

\*\*Other lawful provisions, if any, for the conduct and regulation of the business and affairs of the corporation, for its voluntary dissolution, or for limiting, defining, or regulating the powers of the corporation, or of its directors or members, or of any class of members, are as follows:

### ARTICLE V

The by-laws of the corporation have been duly adopted and the initial directors, president, treasurer and clerk or other presiding, financial or recording officers, whose names are set out on the following page, have been duly elected.

Note: The preceding four (4) articles are considered to be permanent and may only be changed by filing appropriate Articles of Amendment.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

- 1. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific research purposes, including, for such purpose, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the IRC, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code; or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the IRC, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 2. No part of the assets of the corporation and no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in Article Two.
- 3. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
- 4. Except as may be otherwise required or permitted by law, the corporation may at any time authorize a petition for its dissolution to be filed with the Supreme Judicial Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts pursuant to Section 11A of Chapter 180 of the Massachusetts General Laws by the affirmative vote of a majority of the board directors of the corporation then in office; provided, however, that in the event of any liquidation, dissolution, termination, or winding up of the corporation (whenever voluntary, involuntary, or by operation of law), the property or assets of the corporation remaining after providing of the payment of its debt and obligations shall be conveyed, transferred, distributed, and set over outright to one or more educational, charitable, literary institutions or organizations, created and organized for non-profit purpose similar to those of the corporation, contributions to which non-profit institutions or organizations are deductible under Section 170c of the IRC and which qualify as exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of such Code as such sections may, from time to time, be amended or added to or under any successor sections thereto, as a majority of the total number of the directors of the corporation may be vote designate and in such proportions and in such manner as may be determined in such vote; provide, further, that the corporation's property may be applied to charitable, literary or educational purpose in accordance with the doctrine of cy pres in all respects as a court having jurisdiction in the premises may direct.
- 5. In any taxable year in which the corporation is a private foundation as described in IRC section 509(a), the organization shall distribute its income for said period at such

time and manner as not to subject it to tax under IRC section 4942, and the organization shall not: a) engage in any act of self-dealing as define in IRC section 4941(d); b) retain any excess business holding as defined in IRC section 4943(c); c) make any investments in such a manner as to subject the organization to tax under IRC section 4944; or d) make any taxable expenditures as defined in IRC section 4943(d) or corresponding provisions of any subsequent tax laws.

- 6. The corporation shall have the following powers in furtherance of its corporation purpose identified in Article Two aforesaid.
- (a) To have perpetual succession in its corporate name, unless a period for its duration is limited by special law or in its articles of organization;
- (b) To sue and be sued;
- (c) To have a corporate seal, which it may alter at pleasure;
- (d) To elect or appoint directors, officers, employees and other agents, to fix their compensation and define their duties and obligations, and to indemnify such corporate personnel;
- (e) To purchase, receive, take by grant, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, employ, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated; in an unlimited amount.
- (f) To sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of, or mortgage, pledge, encumber or create a security interest in, all or any of its property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;
- (g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, employ, sell, lend, lease, exchange, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, use and otherwise deal in and with, bonds and other obligations, shares, or other securities or interests issued by others, whether engaged in similar or different business, governmental, or other activities;
- (h) To make contracts, give guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge or encumbrance of, or security interest in, all or any of its property or any interest therein, wherever situated;
- (i) To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested;
- (j) To do business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by Mass. G. L. Chapter 180, in any jurisdiction within or without the United States; although the corporation shall not be operated for the primary purpose of carrying

on for profit a trade or business unrelated to its tax exempt purposes.

- (k) To make donations, in such amounts as the members or directors shall determine, irrespective of corporate benefit, for the public welfare or for community fund, hospital, charitable, religious, educational, scientific, civic or similar purposes, and in time of war or other national emergency in aid thereof; provided that, as long as the corporation is entitled to exemption for federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (1) To pay pensions, establish and carry out pension, savings, thrift and other retirement, incentive and benefit plans, trusts and provisions for any or all of its directors, officers and employees.
- (m) To be an incorporator of other corporations of any type or kind.
- (n) To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is formed; provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with this chapter or the general laws of the commonwealth.
- (o) The power to make, amend or repeal by-laws shall be in the hands of directors; provided that if authorized by the articles of organization, the by-laws may provide that the member of the said corporation may also make, amend or repeal the by-laws in whole or in part, except with respect to any provision thereof which by law, the articles or organization or the by-laws requires action by the directors.
- (p) Meeting of the members may be held anywhere in the United States, or anywhere around the world if board of directors deems appropriate and necessary.
